Dear Health Professional:

I am pleased to personally share with you that the State of Michigan will be replacing the current Michigan Automated Prescription System (MAPS) with Appriss Health's PMP AWARe software on April 4, 2017.

This has been a six-month process for the state working in partnership with the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), Department of Technology, Management, and Budget (DTMB), Appriss Health, and stakeholders across Michigan. The MAPS replacement is central to our efforts to prevent opioid abuse and puts Michigan at the forefront of prescription drug monitoring technology.

The new MAPS addresses the problematic issues of the old system. Under the new system prescribers and dispensers are given state-of-the-art tools to make more informed decisions, intervene earlier and spend additional time with patients and customers. Some of the new features include:

- Easy login/password reset
- Data clustering
- Patient alerts
- Queries take 2-5 seconds
- Delegate accounts
- MME reports
- Real time data
- 24/7 Customer Support

MAPS is a powerful tool for providers and practitioners to use before prescribing or dispensing a controlled substance, schedule 2-5 drug. The new system will help prescribers effectively assess the risk of a patient with respect to these highly addictive, abused and diverted drugs. I hope you will join me in our fight against the opioid epidemic and register today to the new MAPS.

It is critical that you **register to the new MAPS by April 3, 2017** so that on April 4, 2017 you are ready to login to the new system. Below is the information needed to register **today**:
